ORGANIZING CITIES, TOWNS AND MUNICIPALITIES

For Uganda to foster organized cities, towns and municipalities which gives citizens a sense of belonging, a sense of direction and a sense of dignity, there is need for City authorities, town councils and municipal councils to,

- 1) Use solar energy, electric cars, paper bags, wind energy and plant trees on all road sides so as to reduce the operation coats and the effects of climate change on top of ensuring that each market has a garbage collection truck which easy the delay of waste disposal.
- 2) Direct all landlords with buildings on the main road to pave their compound up to the main road on top of planting rooftop flowers on condition that you set the paving standards.
- 3) Set up a National Street Kids School (NSKS) where any child you pick from the streets is taken and when he/she clocks eighteen NSKS transfers him/her to a training school of police, military or prison and African countries need to stop coping and pasting child labor policies which treat symptom instead of treating the causes because, my auntie who was working in the stone quarry have five children.
- 4) Award CEOs, MDs, OCs, EDs, CAOs etc. who paint, pave, slash, renovate or modernize their workplace compound, office and fence so as to promote the culture of leadership responsibility on national beautification.
- 5) Ask parliament to enact a law which automatically sentence anyone arrested vending on the street for a one-year hard labor jail term without remission or to pay a court fine of strictly one million shillings to an extent that also landlords/landladies who fail to comply with the paving directive or who allow hawkers to enter their building should as well be fined heavily.
- 6) Work with URA on developing a Shoe Shiner's Operation License (SSOL) on condition that you as well set a standard within which such shiners should position themselves on the streets in an organized, cost effective and fancy way because both the public sector and private sector need the services of shoe shiners not forgetting that the shoe shiners also pay taxes whenever they buy shoe polish on top of paying school fees to educate their children.



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It should be a criminal offence for any technician, carpenter, mechanic, plumber, welder, engineer etc. to work at the workshop, on the site or in the garage without wearing a branded overcoat or overall on duty highlighting the name and contacts of their workshop or garage because when they are wearing ordinary clothes it becomes hard for society and security to distinguish them from lunatics or criminals. But African countries need to stop coping and pasting child labor policies which treat symptom instead of treating the causes because, my auntie who was working in the stone quarry had five children. But for her to raise three thousand Uganda shillings (UGX - 3,000 or US\$ - 0.79) for buy a kilo of maize flour with silver fish for lunch, she had to smash six (6) buckets of stones at five hundred shillings (UGX-500 or US\$-0.13) were each bucket takes about four hours to smash. This essentially means that she had to involve her children in the smashing so as to raise enough money for feeding and renting.
